- 1. Use information from your own knowledge.
- 2. Keep predicting what might happen next or what you might learn.
- 3. Figure out new words, terms, or phrases.
- 4. Make sure you understand what you are reading and correct your own mistakes.
- 5. Create a picture in your mind of what you're reading.



- 6. Connect what you read to what you already know.
- 7. Find the main ideas and events, then figure out how they are connected to each other.
- 8. Get clues from text, charts, graphs, maps, and illustrations.
- 9. Find and interpret literary elements in different genres.
- 10. Summarize and retell what you read.
- 11. Make inferences and draw conclusions. "Read between the lines."
- 12. Think back, reflect, discuss, and respond to what you've read. Give evidence to support your ideas.
