

Shades of Meaning

Are you a collector? Maybe you have a collection of rocks, sports cards, key chains, or seashells kept in an old box. Maybe your collection is more formal, involving airtight

containers or glass display cases. As a writer, you need to be a serious collector of words. A word collection lets you select the words with the perfect shade of meaning to convey your idea.



Sharing an Example: Hope Was Here

In the following passage from Joan Bauer's book, *Hope Was Here*, Hope, a self-described word person, is using her thesaurus to help her work out her feelings. Read the passage carefully.

I took out my Roget's thesaurus, which lists words that have the same meaning. If you're a word person like me, you can't live without one. Say you're trying to get an idea across, like *Gleason Beal is a thief*. You can look up the word "thief" in the thesaurus and come up with a slew of better slams to help you work out your intense feelings.

Reflect

Synonyms are words that have the same or nearly the same meaning. The choices you make as a writer will affect how your readers respond to your ideas.

When looking up synonyms, you need to know what part of speech you're looking for. In the example above, the words thief and hope are nouns. Suppose you wanted a list of synonyms for hope as a verb, as in this sentence: I hope for good things in my life. Use your thesaurus to find three synonyms for the word hope as a verb.
